#### **BAAS** Degrees

#### **Drive to Success**

#### **FabLab**

#### STEP 3 —

#### Apply for Financial Aid and Scholarships

Then visit www.odessa.edu, Click on the Icon "Paying for College" to fill out your Scholarship Application. Note: The FASFA application is FREE, if the site asks you for a credit card please exit the website immediately!

#### STEP 4 —

#### Bacterial Meningitis Shot

The shot is required for all students under the age of 22 prior to registration.

\*Note: Shot expires after 5 years, ensure that your vaccination or booster is current.

#### STEP 5 —

#### Official Transcripts

Mail to: OC RECORDS OFFICE, 201 W. University Blvd, Odessa, TX, 79764, \*Deliver in Person; or send via Electronic Transcript Service such as Clearinghouse or Parchment. Provide official transcripts from your high school and/or all colleges previously attended. Athletes and those applying for financial aid must submit their official high school transcript. Questions? \*Note: It must be sealed in the envelope from the school if opened the transcript is no longer official.

#### Testing - TSIA, ACT, SAT or STAAR

## Student Life Resources

#### **BIT Behavior Intervention**

The Behavior Intervention Team (BIT) provides a proactive and supportive multidisciplinary team approach to prevention, assessment, and intervention of situations or individuals that may pose a threat to the safety and well-being of the campus community.

The BIT is chaired by the Executive Director of Student Life and meets regularly to discuss student cases and recommend appropriate courses of action to keep distraught students on a continued path to success.

It is a primary goal of the BIT to assist students, faculty, and stadd with early interventions to not infringe upon the learning environment any more than necessary.

The BIT also makes recommendations to the campus and other personnel which may improve the physical and emotional health for all students.

#### Sexual Harassment & Title IX

Odessa College is opposed to any and all forms of sexual discrimination or harassment within the college community, and we will take the steps necessary to stop such conduct.

Determining what constitutes sexual harassment can vary according to individual circumstances, but it can be described in general terms as unwanted or unwelcome sexually-oriented behavior, such as physical actions or verbal comments. Which adversely affects the working or learning environment of an individual.

Federal law requires that the College appoint a Title IX coordinator, who is responsible for serving as a resource person on sexual harassment issues and all other forms of discrimination.

The Executive Director of Student Life is the designated harassment prevention/Titel IX coordinator. The Executive Director of Student Life will serve as an advocate for students in distress or a person of contact to initiate campus investigations.

# Wrangler Resources



The Odessa College Drive to success program is led by the Student Life department, and is the ultimate incentive program. Drive to Success was created to encourage student engagement by giving students the opportunity to earn prizes for doing things that are proven to increase overall success in college. Drive to Success is open to all Odessa College students, regardless of modality, who are enrolled at least half-time (6 credit hours or more) in the current semester.

To be eligible for prizes, students must be in good academic standing with a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA, and no major disciplinary violations. All students who are enrolled in at least 6 credit hours are automatically included in the program, with points awarded based on the number of credit hours taken in the current semester. Points are earned through enrollment, or by signing in with Drive to Success at campus events.

#### Points are awarded as follows:

Each year in the spring, five eligible students, drawn at random, participate in the Drive to Success Grand Finale which culminates with one of the five students winning the grand prize of a Ford Mustang. The event is live streamed on social media and broadcast live on a local TV station.




